No awards were presented this month.



#### Details:

The goal: The aim of this workshop is to increase your skills and knowledge of Spanish dresses, with the goal to encourage and support beginner and intermediate sewers to pattern and construct an early 16th century Spanish dress and chemise (optional). Depending on sewing expertise, some may go away with a mostly constructed dress and chemise, whilst others will have most of a bodice down, ready to finish at home. Sewers will be paired up to help each other pattern and we will have teachers checking on progression and helping as needed.

If you are an independent sewer attending our workshop for motivation and inspiration, you will be encouraged to work on your gown as you see fit and supported as much as is possible around that. Any support you can offer to your less experienced sewing friends will be appreciated!

#### What you need to do:

- Register your interest at ginevraworkshops@gmail.com. ASAP. This will enable us to:
  - o book an appropriate room
  - o help us when doing our optional, potentially discounted group order (boning, fastenings, interlining, striped white fabric etc.)
  - o allows us time to speak with other teachers, so we can set an appropriate class size.
- Look out for your booking email once we have confirmed availability of teachers, we will open the bookings. You will receive an email to say that you are being offered a place, or are on the waiting list. You will have 3 days to respond before your place is offered to the next participant on the waiting list.
- Once your booking is confirmed, fees will need to be paid in cash or via direct debit.
- Beginners are highly encouraged to pick from a couple of simple dresses on the Facebook page. This will help us to help you construct a gown by the end of the workshop.

#### When booking, please use the event website.

### What you need to bring:

- Pre washed fabric for dress and chemise
- Preferably pre ironed the aforementioned fabric

- Material: 5-6m of natural fabrics (Thin wool, thick silk, medium to heavy linen, brocades. Brocade, silk and velvet will result in a more formal gown, linens will be a more casual gown/suitable for warmer weather)
- Material: 2-3m of white/white with black lines (Again natural fibres such as linen are best)
- Material: 1-2 m of lining for bodice and sleeves.
- Lining for skirt as well as bodice may be need for thinner materials if in doubt, ask!
- Sewing threads to match fabric of dress and chemise
- Material for the guards/trim (black bands on dress and sleeves) if you choose them (black velvet bias binding, velvet trim, etc)
- Boning
- Interlining
- Lucetting cord/ribbon
- Fastenings
- Pins
- Tailors chalk
- Measuring tape
- Bring a plate to share for lunch, or bring your own if you have dietary requirements.
- Bring personal plate, cup and utensils
- If you have a sewing machine or overlocker, please bring it with you.

### Important dates:

- Registration is open now please email the event steward.
- Bookings open on the 27th of April and the 15th of May is close of Bookings.
- The workshop is held on the 13th and 14th of June

#### Additional information:

- Resources and references will be available on the day.
- A guide and reference will be emailed out to all participants, and printed copies will be available on the day.
- Spanish dresses will be available to look at.
- There is a Facebook group, please join for support and communication.
- Remember to bring water and snacks!
- This is an intensive workshop designed to get you a mostly wearable dress in two days (some hemming or finishing etc at home may be required). You will need to bring all your focus and energy...and perhaps consider leaving your children at home;)
- First day is patterning and constructing of the gown, second day is finishing the gown and constructing a chemise. For early finishers accessory options may be available, otherwise we are sure beginners would appreciate the help.
- An accessories class featuring headgear, jewellery, etc will be held at the Politarchopolis A&S Collegium in August.

## Tayles from Events of Recent Past

Baronial Quarter Day - May

On the 30<sup>th</sup> of Pay, 2015 (Anno Societatis 50), Duchess Liadan ingen Theradaig stewarded the very first Baronial Duarter Day. It was held at the Tuggeranong Archery Kange and attracted approximately 45 participants, including the first event for some of the newcomer's that made an appearance.


Archers, fencers and heavy combatants were encouraged to give favours to someone other than their usual consorts to give newcomer's and non-competitors the chance to participant in the days activities.

21 Archers participated in the target shooting competitions, with The Honourable Lord Thric of Ambledune taking out victory in the non-period divison, scoring 156 points on behalf of his consort for the day, The Honourable Lady Ceara Shionnach. Lord Whintherus Alban was victorious in the period division, scoring 146 points on behalf of his consort for the day, young Fionntán.

7 heavy combatants competed in a tournament, with Jarl Piall inn Drkneyskii, Dux defeating Baron Aonghus Pac Treigor Phic Raghnaill in the best of three finals, on behalf of his consort for the day, Lady Charlotte.

4 rapier combatants competed in a round robin of timed bouts. Each bout lasted 3 minutes and 10 seconds where combatants scored 1 point for each limb they hit and 2 points for each kill they made. The victor was Don Dwain Cantor ap Hugh, scoring 58 points on behalf of his consort for the day, Jocelyn. The Honourable Lady Ceara Shionnach came second with 35 points, Lord Kobin of Ambledune came third on 28 points, and Lady Perrione French placed fourth with 25 points.

In closing court, the populace sang the Happy Birthday Dirge for Lady Caitlin Dai.

The device of the Barony of Politarchopolis is blazoned on the Lochac Roll of Arms: argent, on a pale gules a griffin segreant argent, overall a laurel wreath counterchanged. The laurel wreath is used because, in the SCA, all groups must include a laurel wreath on their device to indicate that status (more information on Assorted Lessons in SCA Heraldry, published on the SCA Armory). The burley-looking griffin was used as a link to Walter Burley Griffin, the architect that designed Canberra. The stripe of red down the middle was intended to give homage to Canberra, representing red tape (linked to politics).

Thank you to those who have provided information for this, the June 2015 edition of Griffintayle.

I'm not sure I have enough space here. But physical and mental practice are important. Armoured and un-armoured training. With and without partners. Watching a lot of good fighters and learning from them. And offered up the soul of one of my children.

What did you enjoy about the tournaments? Please describe a memorable fight for us.


Being challenged. Every fight was fun and different. My glaive fight with Otto. It was damn hard work on every level and I learned a lot from it.

What style do you fight in? Do you have some beginner's tips for those who may be interested in learning to fight this way?

What style? Ugly. If I was asked by a new fighter I might say "Don't copy me". But it depends on so much. My style is what I like and that may not work for others who might like more glory and less renown. What is your favourite thing to do in the SCA?

What preparations have you been making for the final in Queensland?

Preparations? Eat well, sleep well and plan to play my own game. Oh and knights school. And organise to get there and play in the fire light tournament. It is on my bucket list. I'm sure there was something else but I tend to focus on one thing at a time.

What is your SCA name and title?

Baron Aonghus Mac Greigor Mhic Raghnaill.

You came 2nd in the Oltimate Fighter Series in Canberra. What did you do to train?

and in UF Polit, fight, fight, fight!

What did you enjoy about the tournaments? Please describe a memorable fight for us.

I enjoy the challenge of tournaments, especially this format with different styles to make you think, and fight, outside your comfort zone.

My Favourite moment of the tourney was the poll arm against Sir Berenger, we were fighting to confirm the standings and in the previous rounds he had beaten me with Poll. In the refight I went out and fought my game setting the pace of the fight as I wanted and came out with a victory.

What style do you fight in? Do you have some beginner's tips for those who may be interested in learning to fight this way?

I fight primarily Poll axe in the Talhoffer poll axe school, with a big dose of Aonghus thrown in.

For beginners, talk to me! It is a very different style to anything anyone else fights and takes a willingness for percussive learning. You will get hit a lot learning to do this!

What preparations have you been making for the final in Queensland?

For the finals, a lot of mental preparation, slow work training and focusing on the core footwork and shots of the styles for the tournament and K.I.S.S. (Keep It Simple, Stupid).

The Seneschal is the principal legal representative of the Barony (i.e. group president).

#### Arts and Sciences / Rosamund Laiborn

The Arts and Sciences officer is responsible for encouraging the crafts of the Barony.

#### Captain of Archers / Olric of Ambeldune

The Captain of Archers manages the Baronial archery activities (both target and combat).

### Chandler / vacant

The Chandler is responsible for inventory of Baronial items, including regalia and hospit (i.e. garb to be borrowed by newcomers).

#### Chirurgeon / Iseldis of Winchester

The Chirurgeon is responsible for first aid and safety at events.

### Chronicler / Ceara Shionnach

The Chronicler is responsible for the production and publication of the Baronial newsletter, Griffintayle.

#### Constable / see Reeve

The Constable is the primary safety officer at an event, the collector of indemnities, and to administer lost property.

#### Hospitaller /Gabriel van Dorne

The Hospitaller works on the recruitment and retention of new members to the Barony.

#### Herald / Antonia Rucellai

The Herald is responsible for acting as the voice of the Baron and Baroness, and for assisting in registering names and devices with the College of Arms.

### Keeper of the Lists / Fionghuine MacCoinnich

The Keeper of the Lists organises, and keeps track of the results of the various martial competitions in the Barony.

## Marshal / Blethyn ap Gryffd

The Marshal is responsible for martial activities in the Barony.

## Rapier Marshal / Lorccan Ruadh

The Captain of Archers manages the Baronial rapier activities.

#### Reeve / Eberhard Neggerstein

The Reeve is responsible for managing the financial reporting of the Barony (i.e. the group treasurer).

## Virtual Town Crier / Ginevra Lucia di Namoraza

This Virtual Town Crier is responsible for drafting and updating Baronial website content.

#### Webwright / Nicodemus Novello


The Webwright maintains the Baronial website.
