

Tayles from Events of Recent Past

Oltimate Fighter Series - Finals

Over two years, Count Sir Berenger of Plancy co-ordinated the Ultimate Fighter Series. In this, various Baronies held a set of five tournaments locally, with each requiring different weapons combinations. The top two non-belted fighters at the end of the five tournaments (who could get to Great Northern War 2015) were invited to represent their Barony in the finals.

The ten fighters who competed (by Barony) included:

Junilgard: Lord Finnbjorn Skeggesson and Lord Tristan

Mordenvale: Master Orri Vigleiksson and Master Padraig Lowther

Porthern Keaches (Saint Florian and River Haven): Lord Alain Quartier, Kaeso Flavius Artorius Gladius and Lord Lankin Ealdwulf

Politarchopolis: Lord Mark Ottignon and Baron Aonghus mac Griogair mhic Raghnaill

Kowanp: Baron Miles de Colwell

The tournament was a mix of pre-specified-weapons round robin, with Master Orri and Lord Mark placing top two. They fought a best of three finals, with Lord Mark Ottignon victorious on behalf of Politarchopolis. Baron Aonghus also fought valiantly, placing fourth overall in the Finals.

Congratulations to Lord Mark and Baron Aonghus for bringing honour, glory and victory to the Warony.

A History of Politarchopolis - a 20th Anniversary Tribute

The Canberran SCA group was initially formed as a Shire in January 1984 (AS 18) under the name Politikopolis with Agvar Guyvanaspar as the first Seneschal.

The name of this Barony is a play on the fact that Canberra is the capital city of Australia, and the home of Australia's Parliament House.

The device for the Barony, as described on the Lochac Roll of Arms, is:

Argent, on a pale gules a griffin segreant argent, overall a laurel wreath counterchanged.

The device has two elements distinctive of the region - the griffin is a play on the name of Walter Burley Griffin (the architect who designed Canberra) and the red stripe is a play on the concept of red tape (another link to politics).

On its 20th Birthday, the Barony resides over three sub-groups:

- the Canton of Torlyon, which is situated in the Yass region in NSW, has been under the stewardship of Politarchopolis since the 20th of June 2015 (AS 50)
- the College of St Aldhelm, which is situated at the Australian National University in Acton ACT, has been under the stewardship of Politarchopolis since the College was established in September 1987 (AS 22), and
- the College of St Andronicus, which is situated at the University of Canberra in Bruce ACT, has been under the stewardship of Politarchopolis since the College was established on the 21st of March 2012 (AS 47).

Despite being a large group for a long time, Politarchopolis resisted becoming a Barony for several years. In early 1993, the Shire was discussing options for group advancement, with the strongest pushes being for either becoming a chartered town (instead of becoming a Barony) or choosing to do nothing and remain a Shire.

Late that year, an election was held for the advancement, three couples stood - Sir Gareth of Greymarch and his wife, Charles of the Park and Francesca Cellini, and Dafydd ap Donal ap Gwilym and the then Seneschal Isabeau Chanteuse. The election was held on a weekend at a park, and Stephen Aldred and Mathilde Adycote were the returning officers. The ballot was accompanied by a market day and general activities. During the voting, extra ballot papers "mysteriously" appeared and by "careful" distraction of the returning officers the ballot box was bulging by day's end. All was not lost, however, as it seems that the ballot box stuffers were colourblind and the tally of checked voters aligned with the number of approved red ballot papers in the ballot box. Blue, green yellow white and other coloured ballot papers were discounted from the official count. At the end of the day, Daffyd and Isabeau were announced the narrow winners (by 2 and 3 votes respectively) over Gareth and his wife and Charles and Francesca.

Twelve months later, the advancement papers had still not been submitted and the Society Seneschal passed word back through Prince Brusi Anderson of the Shetlands that the poll result was now invalid by age. The populace was then re-polled on the matter of advancement, specifically on whether that advancement was preferred to take form as a Barony or a Chartered Town. Advancing to Barony was the decision resulting from the poll, and a third poll was called to decide on who the first Baron and Baroness might be.

In that poll Dafydd ap Donal ap Gwilym and Isabeau Chanteuse stood again, and Stephen Aldred and Mathilde Adycote of Mynheniot also stood. The third poll was held on a winter's day on Carillion Island in Lake Burley Griffin. It was again accompanied by a Fair Day and Tournament. The votes were tallied at the end of the day, and Stephen and Mathilde were announced as the clear victors, becoming Baron and Baroness elect. As such, Stephen and Mathilde were tasked with running the advancement process.

At the time the advancement process was taking place, Politarchopolis was the largest group in Lochac with well over 100 active members, and it was said to be the largest Shire in the Known Worlde (though that may just have been speculation). In any case, the papers were submitted and passed to the West Kingdom Seneschal for endorsement and the formal approval of advancement was announced in Lochac during the Principality reign of <u>Prince Bran of Lochiel and Princess Cairistiona</u> nic Bheathain.

The advancement petition was formally presented to the Crown of the West at Rowany Festival 1995, making it the second successive Festival where an advancement petition had been submitted (the other being for Ynys Fawr the previous year).

The Shire was finally elevated to Baronial status on the 1st of July 1995 in the Queanbeyan Town Hall (NSW). This was the same hall that Lochac's First Coronation was eventually ran at (these being the only two times to date that this venue has been used by the SCA). Prince Peter du Gant Noir and Princess Muirghein ni Ghrainne presided over the advancement, and the event was attended by all of the then sitting Barons and Baronesses of Lochac (which made for a rather large High Table). Much fun and merriment was had, including (rather late in the evening) choral renditions by the Barons' choir (the Landed Barons).

The lead up to the event did not go entirely smoothly. The award tokens for the Order of the Burley Griffin were not ready and so on the night before the event Princess Muirghein calligraphed a scroll for the first recipient - Francesca Cellini and the soon to be Baron Stephen acid etched further tokens for recipients on the second day. The Great sword of state was somehow left behind and the messenger sent to bring it could not unlock the house, so a great sword was borrowed from a wayfaring Scotsman and the Baronial oaths were sworn on it. The Seneschal at the time Lorenzo D'Erudito went forward and petitioned the Crown to elevate Politarchopolis to a Barony. The Coronet then called the populace forward and asked their opinion. On mass affirmation Lorenzo was asked if there were suitable people in the populace to take the arduous task of Baron and Baroness and again by popular acclaim Stephen and Mathilde were named and called forward.

During their first Court, Stephen and Mathilde appointed a guard and opened some of the Baronial Awards. Squire Hugh the Little was appointed Baronial Champion, Squire Vladimir Ivanovitch Kurgan was appointed Baronesses Champion, Squire Brennan Halfhand was the inaugural Sergeant of the Guard, all three have since been awarded the accolade of knighthood. The Order of the Burley Griffin was inaugurated as was the Order of the Cordon Rouge. The Cordon Rouge is the highest award offered by the Barony and is only issued once per year. At the investiture court one was given for each year of the Politarchopolis' existence an incomplete list reads – Alan Brain, Kiriel, Isabeau Chanteusse, Charles of the Park, Cristoval Gitano, At the first Baronial event after investiture the Order was also conferred on Sir Brusi Anderson who had been unable to attend investiture, and the order was then closed to no more than one per year.

On the 2nd of July 1995, a tourney and revel was held at the ANU. The first bout of the tourney saw the new Baron Stephen crossing swords with Prince Peter and, as is right and proper, Prince Peter was victorious. It was one of those

glorious Canberra mid-winter days and although cold it was beautifully sunny and clear. At their Sunday court Stephen and Mathilde added additional members to the Order of the Burley Griffin (which is given for Arts Martial, Arts and Sciences and Service), and inaugurated the Orders of the Griffin's Egg (children's award) and the Griffin's Wing (for wayfarers who contribute to Politarchopolis).

The Baronial Coronels have eight points and under each point is a Burley Griffin. The Coronels were designed by Francesca Cellini and using the advice of Tovye and Aislinn (the founding Baron and Baroness of Innilgard) were made light. The Coronels were made out of silver by Loyola Juan Sanchez Mendoza, who cast an extra Burly Griffin that Politarchopolis has used to cast tokens in lesser metals (for example, pewter) for the order of the Burley Griffin.


During their tenure, Stephen and Mathilde had many enjoyable times and inaugurated:

- the Politarchopolis Fellowship of Grace (for courtesy) for which the badge is a sun in its splendour (the prime charge in Mathilde's personal arms),
- Pensioners of Politarchopolis, which provides an annual stipend of gold coins (chocolate) and peppercorns for retired guardsmen and Sergeants of the guard,
- Free Citizen of Politarchopolis which has no token but offers the recipient free entry to Politarchopolin events. The inaugural recipient of this award was Owen van Norden for making and gifting the Baronial Sword of state. At that time Owen lived in St Florian and had no plans to move to Politarchopolis. He has since and I understand refuses free entry to events, as do the other later recipients.
- The Politarchopolis St Florian alliance (also referred to as the Axis of Evil) was forged and for all but one year of his Baronial tenure Baron Stephen led one of the armies at Rowany Festival. This was spawned by the Politarchopolis/St Florian fine food contest which St Florian made the first entry to at a winter coronation. At that event Baron Stephen accepted the St Florian challenge and replied with a calligraphed Marzipan scroll (which was delivered into court in a pizza box) so that St Florian's could eat his words. The Politarchopolis event was the good food feast, ably stewarded by the Politarchopolis assault catering corps.
- Border war also began during that time with Baron Rudolph of Stormhold and Stephen breaking arrows and
 issuing challenge.
- Table top trebuchets were introduced to local feasts and all in all much fun and merriment was had.


After five and a bit years in October 2000 Stephen and Mathilde stepped aside. To date, there have been six sets of Landed Gentry (i.e. landed Barons and Baronesses) ruling over Politarchopolis:

- 1. Stephen Aldred and Mathilde Adycote of Mynheniot, invested on 1 July 1995 and stepped down on 9 September 2000.
- 2. François Henri Guyon and Aelfthrythe of Saxony, invested on 9 September 2000 and stepped down on 31 January 2004.
- 3. Edmund Ale-conner and Leta von Goslar, invested on 31 January 2004 and stepped down on 2 September 2006.
- 4. Alessandro von Florenz and Isobel le Bretoun, invested on 2 September 2006 and stepped down on 30 October 2010.
- 5. Aonghus mac Griogair mhic Raghnaill and Ginevra Lucia di Namoraza, invested on 30 October 2010 and stepped down on 30 November 2013.
- 6. Crispin Sexi and Joan Sutton, invested on 30 November 2013.

People of Politarchopolis

The Town Crier, Baroness Ginevra Lucia di Pamoraza, will be periodically interviewing members of the populace and publishing these interviews on the Baronial website, and in Griffintayle.

This month, Baroness Dinevra interviewed Baroness Anne de Tournai - current Seneschal of Politarchopolis:

What is your S(A name and title?

Baroness Anne de Tournai.

What is your heraldry and what does it mean to you?

Gules, three seeblätter and a chief engrailed Or. I was lucky enough to have my device designed by Mistress Sabine du Bourbonnais. I'd never found anything that really appealed to me. Sabine suggested I look at seeblatts - Burgundian Heraldic lilies. They're simple, clean, easy to draw (very important) and I like that you don't see them often.

How long have you been playing?

I went to my first event in 1992 in River Haven which makes it 23 years, although I had a period where I wasn't actively attending events.

What inspires you in the SCA?

I get inspired by many things. It's watching simple kindnesses freely offered that shape a new person's perception of the game. Grace under fire - someone who may be struggling mundanely not letting this negatively shape how they interact with other members of the populace. People gifted with skills, freely sharing and just enriching the everyday environment. We have a pretty amazing community.

What is your favourite thing to do in the S(A?

I'm sure it will shock people but I love to cook. Feeding people the best possible meal and getting them excited about medieval food.

What's the best dish you have tasted?

Mistress Kiriel's Duck Pies, Baroness Getrud's Plum tart... oh this is so hard. Try the food at feasts, try all of it. You may not like it but that's okay, you might just find the best thing you ever tasted and discover a whole new taste sensation.

What is the largest or scariest project you have undertaken?

When Fields of Gold hit 320 through the gates - that was pretty intense. However, I had a great team, contingency plans, portion controlled menus and a good handle on my budget.

What would you like to see more of in the SCA?

I would love to see more focus on the courtly aspects of the game. It's not that anyone isn't doing enough, it's just that for me it creates those magic moments. It's the knight inspired by his lady or her lord, it's the artisan gifting of themselves for the joy of others, the person taking the moment to celebrate the small achievement that will echo large throughout someone's SCA life.

Share with us a funny or favourite SCA story...

One of my friends when asked what struck him at his first event replied "I walked into the hall and none of the women had feet!" He was talking about the frocks but it sounded like someone had pinched them!

What advice do you have for newcomers?

Work out what you enjoy, take it slowly and then once you've worked it out - do that! Try everything once - you'll never know what excites you and brings you the most joy if you don't try! 99% of the people in the SCA are just like you, people who are excited and just wanting to share their joy.

Maron / Crispin Sexi / Maroness / Foan Sutton

The Baron and Baroness are the leaders of the Barony, representing the Crown.

Seneschal / Anne de Tournai

The Seneschal is the principal legal representative of the Barony (i.e. group president).

Arts and Sciences / Rosamund Laiborn

The Arts and Sciences officer is responsible for encouraging the crafts of the Barony.

Captain of Archers / Olric of Ambeldune

The Captain of Archers manages the Waronial archery activities (both target and combat).

(handler / vacant

The Chandler is responsible for inventory of Baronial items, including regalia and hospit (i.e. garb to be borrowed by newcomers).

Chirurgeon / Iseldis of Winchester

The Chirurgeon is responsible for first aid and safety at events.

Chronicler / Ceara Shionnach

The Chronicler is responsible for the production and publication of the Baronial newsletter, Tiffmtayle.

Constable / see Reeve

The Constable is the primary safety officer at an event, the collector of indemnities, and to administer lost property.

Hospitaller /Gabriel van Dorne

The Hospitaller works on the recruitment and retention of new members to the Barony.

Herald / Antonia Rucellai

The Herald is responsible for acting as the voice of the Baron and Baroness, and for assisting in registering names and devices with the College of Arms.

Keeper of the Lists / Fionghuine MacCoinnich

The Keeper of the Lists organises, and keeps track of the results of the various martial competitions in the Barony.

Marshal / Blethyn ap Gryffd

The Marshal is responsible for martial activities in the Barony.

Rapier Marshal / Lorccan Ruadh

The Captain of Archers manages the Baronial rapier activities.

Reeve / Eberhard Neggerstein

The Reeve is responsible for managing the financial reporting of the Barony (i.e. the group treasurer).

Virtual Town (rier / Ginevra Lucia di Namoraza

This Virtual Town Crier is responsible for drafting and updating Baronial website content.

Webwright / Nicodemus Novello


The Webwright maintains the Baronial website.

About the Barony

The Barony of Politarchopolis is based in Canberra, Australia, and is part of the Bingdom of Lochac. Part of the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA), we are an educational, non-profit organisation dedicated to the study and re-creation of all aspects of life in pre-17th-century medieval and renaissance society.
