RECIPES FOR ALMOND MACAROONS

(as eaten at Ball D'Argent)

To Make French Biskit Bread (original recipe: Elinor Fettiplace, 1602)

Take one pound of almonds blanched in cold water, beat them verie smale, put in some rose water to them, in the beating, wherein some musk hath lien, then take one pound of sugar beaten and searced and beat with your almonds, then take the whites of fowre eggs beaten and put to the sugar & almonds, then beat it well altogether, then heat the oven as hot as you doe for other biskit bread, then take a paper and strawe some sugar upon it, and lay two spoonfulls of the stuff in a place, then lay the paper upon a board full of holes, & put them into the oven as fast as you can, & so bake them, when they begin to looke somewhat browne they are baked inough.

Almond Macaroons (redaction: Hilary Spurling in Elinor Fettiplace's Receipt Book p224)

4oz. ground almonds
4oz. icing sugar
1 beaten egg white

little rosewater

Work all these together, beating hard, to make a pliable dough. Lay spoonfuls of the dough [onto a baking tray]. Thickness is important, [regardless of the size of the macaroons they should be a finger width thick]. The biscuits should be crisp on the outside but still soft and chewy in the middle. [Cook for approximately] 35 to 45 minutes in a low to moderate oven (Mark 4, 180oC, 350oF, turned down little after the first quarter of an hour).

Almond Macaroons - Meliora's notes

Spurling tends to ramble a fair bit when redacting recipes; all of the instructions in square brackets above are where I have paraphrased her instructions for brevity. If you wish to read the original it is: Spurling, Hilary (1986) Elinor Fettiplace's Receipt Book: Elizabethan Country House Cooking, Penguin Books. ISBN: 0140469567 (pbk). It is currently in-print and costs \$14.95.

Also,

* I take them out of the oven when they appear to have developed a shell and just started to change colour. They taste the best if they have a thin crispy shell and a chewy centre.

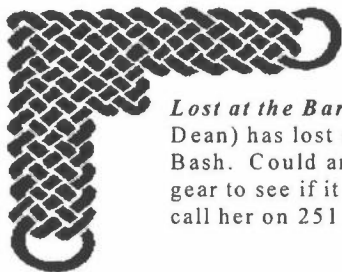
* I roll spoonfuls of the dough between my hands to make soft balls before placing them on the baking sheets. I also find that if I moisten my hands in a little rosewater when rolling the balls it helps to form the shell.

* I found that a double batch of Spurling's mixture makes about 25 macaroons. each the size of a 50 cent piece.
