People of Politarchopolis

The Town Crier, Baroness Ginevra Lucia di Pamoraza, will be periodically interviewing members of the populace and publishing these interviews on the Baronial website, and in Griffintayle.

This month, Baroness Dinevra interviewed Jarl Piall inn Drkneyski:

What is your S(A name and title?

Biall inn Drkneyski. I have a Duchy and Linighthood, but I use the Porse title of Jarl. I sometimes add Dux to the end of my name which is the origin of the title Duke and is a Roman title for a leader who held no rank in the Roman legions.... Julius Ceasar used the term to refer to Celtic Generals.

What is your heraldry and what does it mean to you?

Sable, 3 serpents involved in annulo Or, within a bordure Or.

Essentially 3 gold ouroboros on a black field.

The ouroboros is an ancient symbol found in almost all cultures in some way or another. The universality and mysticism associated with it has fascinated me for a long time. I have one tattooed on my arm.

How long have you been playing?

In total 8 years. I played for a year or so in Agaricus and Kowany in 2001/2, then started playing again in Polit in 2008.

What inspires you in the SCA?

My consort of course.

Also seeing good people acknowledged and rewarded for their hard work and skill in the game.

What is your favourite thing to do in the SCA?

Fight! Armored combat. Tourney, melee and recently I have come to love war fighting and leading from the front.

What's the best dish you have tasted?

There has been many great dishes over the years, too many to choose from, but I like dishes that have mundane equivalents and suit mundane tastes such as roast meats with gravy.

What is the largest or scariest project you have undertaken?

My current project as Earl Marshal, trying to re-write the fighters handbook.

What would you like to see more of in the SCA?

People embracing the creative anachronism aspects.... It's a game, stop judging each other and have fun doing what YOU want to do.

Share with us a funny or favourite S(A story...

My favourite SCA story has to be when Liadan and I surprise Linighted Sir Bleddyn.

His Knight, Duke Spiridean snuck into Lochac from Drachenwald just to be there for the moment.... He snuck onsite for the event, and when the moment was right in our Court he emerged from the back of the event site and asked that we Knight Bleddyn...

What advice do you have for newcomers?

Take advice from those you like and want to be like, but see people for who they are to you and how they treat others, don't take someone else's word about a person, talk to that person and form your own opinions.

Always remember, the SCA is a game, it is not life, don't let SCA interfere with your family and your mundane aspirations and goals... If you are stressed or upset by the game, then it's time to take stock and remember it's just a game.

Maron / Crispin Sexi / Maroness / Foan Sutton

The Baron and Baroness are the leaders of the Barony, representing the Crown.

Seneschal / Anne de Tournai

The Seneschal is the principal legal representative of the Barony (i.e. group president).

Arts and Sciences / Alexandra Hartshorne

The Arts and Sciences officer is responsible for encouraging the crafts of the Barony.

Captain of Archers / Olric of Ambeldune

The Captain of Archers manages the Baronial archery activities (both target and combat).

(handler / vacant

The Chandler is responsible for inventory of Baronial items, including regalia and hospit (i.e. garb to be borrowed by newcomers).

Chirurgeon / Iseldis of Winchester

The Chirurgeon is responsible for first aid and safety at events.

Chronicler / Ceara Shionnach

The Chronicler is responsible for the production and publication of the Baronial newsletter, Griffintayle.

Constable / see Reeve

The Constable is the primary safety officer at an event, the collector of indemnities, and to administer lost property.

Hospitaller / Gabriel van Dorne

The Hospitaller works on the recruitment and retention of new members to the Barony.

Herald / Antonia Rucellai

The Herald is responsible for acting as the voice of the Baron and Baroness, and for assisting in registering names and devices with the College of Arms.

Keeper of the Lists / Fionghuine MacCoinnich

The Keeper of the Lists organises, and keeps track of the results of the various martial competitions in the Barony.

Marshal / Blethyn ap Gryffd

The Marshal is responsible for martial activities in the Barony.

Rapier Marshal / Lorccan Ruadh

The Captain of Archers manages the Baronial rapier activities.

Reeve / Eberhard Neggerstein

The Reeve is responsible for managing the financial reporting of the Barony (i.e. the group treasurer).

Virtual Town (rier / Ginevra Lucia di Namoraza

This Virtual Town Crier is responsible for drafting and updating Baronial website content.

Webwright / Nicodemus Novello

The Webwright maintains the Baronial website.

Canton of Torlyon Seneschal / Alex the Potter

The Seneschal of the Canton of Torlyon is the group president for the Yass, NSW chapter of the Barony.

St Aldhelm Seneschal / Elena Versare

The Seneschal of the College of St Aldhelm is the group president for the Australian National University chapter of the Barony.

St Andronicus Seneschal / Caitlin Dai

The Seneschal of the College of St Andronicus is the group president for the University of Canberra chapter of the Barony.
