Greetings Politarchopolis, harken to some news regarding the upcoming Rowany Festival! After consultation with His Excellency, I wish to announce that I shall be Politarchopolis campsite warden and I will also be organising the food fund.

Food Fund pricing per person:

* Sunday set up day dinner until the final Tuesday breakfast: \$156

* Monday pre-event dinner until the final Tuesday breakfast: \$138

* Tuesday dinner to the final Tuesday breakfast: \$120

* Thursday dinner to Monday lunch: \$80

* Individual meals: \$7

* Children eat for half price.

Message me to sign up to the food fund.

Every adult in the food fund will need to work one or two full meal shifts throughout the event (depending one how much of the event they'll be there for). This involves preparing the food, serving it and cleaning up afterwards. Approximately 2 hours per shift.

IF YOU DON"T WANT TO BE IN THE FOOD FUND, you can still camp in the Politarchopolis campsite, that's totally alright. Make sure to select "Politarchopolis" when booking your tickets to the event. You'll just need to sort out your own food or avail yourself of the catering at the great hall.


