We are very passionate about the diversity and equality of the populace, ensuring the SCA is a place free to be authentic in a multitude of ways.

We are avid proponents of pageantry, knowing that the presentation and visual spectacle of an event, whether at Kingdom level or Canton potluck, adds to the atmosphere, enjoyment, vision and sheer exuberance of events. We enjoy the service that comes with events, creating an atmosphere of enjoyment, creativity and community. As the Baronage represents the Crown, we recognise the importance of what They stand for, the role They have across our wondrous Kingdom and the commitment and love They have for it. We promise that should the Crown ask of us to serve as Your representatives, we will be present, open to advice and endeavour to do all we can to enhance and support the Barony, Crown, populace and SCA dream. We commit to maintaining our memberships and presence for the duration of our Baronage should we be chosen.

Of ourselves:

I, Semeon, have been a member of the SCA for over 30 years and have lived in Politarchopolis for most of that time. From its time as a shire, through the process to become a Barony I have helped to pave the path to where we stand now. I have served Politarchopolis in a multitude of ways, including as the first Baronesses' champion to Mathilde and have stood as the Baronial Champion no less than three times. I have served in Baronial and Royal households, held several officers' positions within the Barony, notably as Seneschal and Marshal. During my time I have been a part of event teams, and stewarded a number of events, notably the first Viking war (many moons ago) and recently Fields of Gold XI. I have also served as a member of the SCA Australia Board of Directors.

I am active in the marshallate and as a combatant in all disciplines. My passion for the martial arts crosses to the realm of arts and sciences where I make my own armour and garb, continuously seeking to improve my presentation, franchise, skills and knowledge. Currently my passion is the Varangian period, however during my time I have enjoyed researching and creating garb and armour across other times. Of note when I fence it is as a Landsknecht rather than a Varangian (they won't let me fence with a Daneaxe!). I am currently the Kingdom Arbitrator, a role that involves me investigating matters given to me by the Kingdom Seneschal and handing down findings to them to enable a decision to be made.

Outside the SCA I am a long time role-player and war gamer, having received awards internationally for gaming and the painting and presentation of war gaming miniatures. My roleplaying ability in particular has stood me in good stead in the SCA, in my presentation, franchise and ability to organise and portray a persona. Mundanely I am a public servant in an operational planning, administration and organisational reporting role, prior to that I was a Police Officer for 23 years. My experience has made me an extremely competent communicator at all levels and given me a well-developed sense of equity, justice, procedural fairness

and open-mindedness. ---

I, Beatrice, have been a member of the SCA for over 30 years, starting my journey in River Haven before travelling to Ynys Fawr and settling my feet in Politarchopolis for the last six years. Early in my SCA career, I had the honour of wayfaring to witness the creation of this Barony. Back then, Politarchopolis made a strong impression on me with its generosity of time, knowledge and hospitality. My travels were always met with kindness, joy and laughter. I had dreamt of living in these fair lands, and now I'm here the reality is even better than I envisioned. Over the years I have served the SCA in many ways: from holding offices at Canton, Baronial and Kingdom levels, including Kingdom Seneschal (2020-2022), Ynys Fawr Baronial Seneschal (2018) and Canton of Castellum Montanum Seneschal (many times between 2000-2009). My service has also been behind the scenes of events. I have held a number of roles at many small and large events - including stewarding Rowany Festival (2018/2023), Great Northern War (2011/2014), Crownination II (2021) and Valentines (2023). My service extends to supporting Royal and Baronial households in coordination roles and as guard, which provided a strong foundation and support network when I had the honour of inspiring Count Henri to win the 21st Crown of Lochac, which I hold dear. I am the current Deputy Kingdom Seneschal for Crown Events, which is a role I love. However if we are successful in our nomination I will stand aside to ensure Politarchopolis has the attention it merits.

Across my time, I have learned a wide variety of skills both artistic and martial. I am an armoured combatant (which I am hopeful to be in armour more in the coming years), not very good at archery but I will keep trying. I enjoy costuming, embroidery and cooking. My interests are diverse - I have a place in my wardrobe for Norse, mid -late I4C and I6C lower Germany (with some camp garb thrown in). I am passionate about the SCA, and enjoy every moment that I get to immerse myself into it, and have fun along the way!

The Letter of Intent of Llewellyn and Rosa -

Unto Their Majesties Kitan and Alesia, do Lord Llewellyn de Guerre and Lady Rosa Frye send greetings.

Please accept this letter as notice of our intent to stand as candidates for Baron and Baroness of Politarchopolis and the Cantons of Okewaite and Torlyon.

In support of our candidacy we offer the following as evidence of our suitability for these roles, the reverence in which we hold these positions, and our vision for the Barony should we be found suitable in the Crown's eyes and the eyes of the populace.

We are wayfarers, entertainers, makers and fighters. We have built households, led warbands, supported colleges and represented the Barony and Lochac at home and abroad.

At Pennsic War we represented Lochac on the rapier war field, sang with pirates in the Tilted Tavern and supped with royalty at Casa Bardicci. In the Midrealm, Canterbury Fair, Fencing Fest and the Guilded Symposium we were welcomed with warm hospitality and practised our fighting arts, learning from rapier masters and our fellow students alike.

As Baron and Baroness we would impart these experiences through words and actions to increase the depth of culture in the Barony. To this end, and acknowledging the cost of living crisis that constrains many from fully participating in the SCA experience, we are keen to investigate creation of a fund to support more young people to wayfare. This would also support more travel to the Cantons.

The Barony is our home and we are its servants. Llewellyn currently serves as a Baronial Guardsman and has served as Seneschal, Arts and Science Officer, Chirurgeon and Reeve. Rosa has been Baronial Rapier Champion, and is currently a Royal Guardsman.

Becoming the next Baron and Baroness is an opportunity to serve the Barony in a new role, to represent the populace at events at home and throughout the Kingdom and Knowne World. On a personal note, this role would allow us to fulfil our passion of enabling people to do the things they love and to recognise and award their achievements in their chosen field.

Politarchopolis has always been a strong Barony with diverse peoples and rich lands. We seek to build on the foundations of the great Baronial leaders who have come before, to strengthen the sense of community in the Barony. Making this vision sustainable requires as much transparency as possible to build trust, and seeking out and understanding opinions that differ from our own.

Through our mundane careers and experiences in our personal lives we have developed a strong suite of relevant skills that have enabled us to successfully navigate complex political and social environments, and to lead and develop peers, colleagues, friends and teams through these. As Baron and Baroness we would leverage these skills to work with all members of the Barony to find a balance and create an inclusive environment that enables people to pursue the things they want to achieve, and to feel safe to participate and try new things.

This can be as simple as connecting people with like interests and commonalities, as nuanced as assisting people to find alternative ways to meet their needs and achieve their goals, and as challenging as confronting behaviours and situations perceived to be exclusionary, negative or damaging. We enjoy and believe strongly in supporting others and see providing pastoral care as a strong feature of this role.

Politarchopolis is renowned for its majestic Kingdom events. Big events provide the opportunity for the Barony to showcase the skills of its populace. As Baron and Baroness we would see this continue and would also actively encourage smaller, local events. Smaller events are advantageous; they provide an opportunity to develop new stewards and allow for experimentation in cuisine and style with reduced risk and pressure. They are also generally cheaper, which will allow more people to attend.

Food is at the heart of many cultures, and smaller events will strengthen the culture of the Barony, binding the populace through the sharing of food and experiences in fun and intimate settings at a variety of locations around the Barony and its Cantons. Reflecting that we want people to bring their whole selves to the SCA, we would also create a regular mundane event to bring people together outside the confines of the SCA. This is a practice the Households of Politarchopolis do well and we feel the Barony would benefit from applying similar.

Politarchopolis is blessed with many fine makers able to produce an exceptional variety of goods. As makers ourselves we understand the investment of time required to develop these skills and the importance of Arts and Sciences to our Barony and the game more broadly. We are both students to members of the Order of Defence. Llewellyn is squired to Mistress Kiriel du Papillion and a blacksmith with interest in leather and wood-working. Rosa is working with a peer to learn patterning and tailoring.

The Arts and Sciences bring pageantry to our game. As Baron and Baroness we would use our experience as storytellers and role players to incorporate multiple interactive elements into a singular narrative to enrich the game and deliver an engaging experience for all involved.

While we would suspend formal agreements with our teachers were we successful in this application, we would remain committed to learning these arts and would encourage the same from others.

We are a stable couple with a strong relationship and history of supporting each other through difficult times. We have an excellent understanding of each other's strengths and weaknesses and a good personal support network around us. We understand that the role of Baron and Baroness is a marathon event and would increase our existing network with members of the Barony to ensure one of us is always available and to promote a culture in the populace where members support each other.

We seek to hold these lands for the Crown and to drive its continued prosperity through our actions, words and deeds.
