It's up to you how many UFOs you identify, and how you choose to finalise each one. If you want, post photos of projects, progress or finished to Polit A&S on FB, bring to the Ainslie Hall or Quercus Field or at household gatherings. You can finalise a project in a variety of ways:

- finish the project in another way
- pull it apart and repurpose the components
- give it away unfinished





Baronial Hall Fees

Hi all, if you attend the Polit hall days at Ainslie, it's time to pay fees for the first quarter or the year, or for the full year if paying yearly. It costs \$200 per year, or \$50 for each quarter, or \$30 per quarter if you are a pensioner or unemployed (incl students). Pay by direct deposit (BSB 032778, Account 469607, SCA Polit, put "hall [your name]" as the reference).

Make your life and my life easier by paying for the rest of the year now!

If you come rarely, you can pay per time, or consider paying the quarterly fees anyway to support your group.

The daily payment is \$6 to help cover our hall costs. If you come on Tuesdays and Sundays, you need to pay each time, or pay the quarterly fee. If you're not an SCA member, there is an extra \$10 adults or \$5 kids each visit which is an insurance charge.
