

Hello Barony!

I will be running a Baronial silk banner making workshop, across 4-weekends, over February 1st, 8th, 15th and March 1st. This workshop is limited to 10 people.

Sessions will last up to 1.5 hours working to a 2:15pm setup to start at 2:30pm timeframe.

This is a learning mechanism. What we will be doing is creating 10 Baronial banners. What you will get out of this is being shown the process from woad to go. The Barony will end up with not only banners but the general infrastructure (frames, pins and elastic bands) to make further banners, including being borrowed for personal use.

What is required from you? Commitment over the 4 sessions to help with the making process.

You'll learn how to attach silk to a frame, drawing on the design with gutta, techniques for applying the dye, and how to finish the banner for use. All materials will be provided, including the templates.

Session 1 – Overview of the process and starting to stretch the silk onto frames.

Session 2 – Finishing any silk stretching and applying the gutta.

Session 3 – Doing the dyeing. Tips, tricks, and things to watch out for.

Session 4 – Making the hoists, ironing, and rolled hems. D-O-N-E.

NB: This process is also planned to be replicated for Okewaite and Torlyon. But it would be extremely helpful for an attendee from each canton to be present at these initial sessions.

Sign In at events and activities

So please if you are a member please use the Member SCA Attendance transaction record.

This is for Adults and Minor Members and an Adult must sign for the Minor.

If you are a Non-Member please use the Non-Member SCA Attendance transaction Record, you must also fill out the Adult Non Member & Member without proof of membership indemnity form.

Please also ensure you put the correct payment details on the forms as announced by the Reeve on Page 11.

If you have any problems then please ask in the hall and they can direct you to someone that can assist you.

At Events there will be a Constable or Gate Keeper who is there to ensure all those that have booked are signed in correctly.

Members are required to show their current Membership card and sign the Member SCA Attendance transaction record. If they can not produce their card then they must complete the Adult Non Member & Member without proof of membership indemnity form. Remember the Constables and Gate are there to help you.

Designed for attendees of all ages a range of competitions will be held throughout the day:

A Contest of Artisans - There are many tales of moments when King Arthur and his knights were struck by some fine object that delighted the senses with the skill of its making. Artisans of all ages and ranks are invited to present their finest recent works, and we advise all to visit this display of art and skill to feast their eyes and indicate the work they think is most worthy of renown.

A Rose Tourney for Armoured and Rapier Combatants - As kings and nobles did of old when they held round table tournaments in memory of King Arthur, we challenge combatants of all ranks to display their prowess using blunted weapons, so that courage and chivalry may be displayed without injury to any. This tourney shall be a rose tourney, so that entrants shall fight for the glory of others.



Fighting, feasting, costuming, crafting, music, dance... if it was done in pre-17th century Europe, we know someone interested in recreating it.




